Atlassian Williams F1 Team Keeps Sensitive Data Protected From Factory to Pit Lane



Background

Atlassian Williams F1 Team is one of the most historic teams in Formula 1, founded in 1977 by Sir Frank Williams and Patrick Head. Based in Grove, Oxfordshire, UK, the team has won nine Constructors' Championships and seven Drivers' Championships – among the most decorated teams in Formula 1 history. Known for its engineering excellence and competitive spirit, Williams focuses on innovation and performance, leveraging cutting-edge technology and data analytics to compete in the fast-changing world of motorsport.

The Challenge

Formula 1 is the most data-intensive sport on the planet, making it a high-value target for cyber attacks. Atlassian Williams F1 Team generates upwards of 1TB of telemetry, aerodynamic and simulation data every race weekend, with over 400 sensors on each car feeding 30,000 data channels live to engineers at the circuit and back at Grove simultaneously. The credentials protecting access to that data can carry the same strategic value as the data itself.

“F1 is a team sport — without all the teams working together on the same task, nothing works. We don't want security to be the blocker. People need to access what they need, when they need it.”

Around 1,200 personnel work across the entire organisation – from the wind tunnel to trackside race operations. Each requires precise, role-appropriate access throughout a season spanning more than 20 countries. Every pound spent is governed by Formula 1's cost cap, which limits how much teams can invest in personnel, equipment and operations each season. That means security spending is weighed directly against performance-driving investments in the car itself.

“It's a real conversation weighing the purchase of a security tool versus a new front wing or a new mechanical engineer. We have to prove demonstrable value from the tool when we put it forward.”

Collaboration: Sharing at the Speed of F1

Keeper's shared folders and role-based permissions ensure personnel are automatically provisioned with exactly the credentials they need to succeed. One-Time Share provides contractors and third parties with time-limited access that expires automatically, requiring no manual intervention. Keeper is accessible across all managed browsers, devices and operating systems, ensuring users can access the credentials they need when and where they need them. From the trackside team to the marketing team, Keeper reduces friction for users.

Encryption: Protection Built for High-Value Data

Keeper's zero-knowledge, zero-trust architecture means encryption keys are generated client-side and never stored on Keeper's servers. Elliptic-Curve Cryptography, AES-256-bit encryption and PBKDF2 are layered across the vault, folder and record levels, with MFA and biometric authentication enforced across all systems.

"It would take a cybercriminal over 2,000 years to decrypt the encrypted data. The keys are generated client-side with Atlassian Williams F1 Team. We store ones and zeros. That's it."

Keeper also layers in quantum-resistant encryption using the Kyber algorithm to defend against the "harvest now, decrypt later" threat, where adversaries store encrypted data today to decrypt it once quantum computing becomes viable.

"In F1, you've always got to be thinking about the next regulation cycle. It's great to see Keeper taking that same philosophy of thinking down the line about how to protect us from what we know is coming next."
